

# FLIGHT BAGGAGE INFORMATION

## CHECKED BAG (\$25 each way)

Checked baggage service charges are collected at any point in the itinerary where bags are checked. The bag service charges below reflect a maximum outside linear dimension of 62 linear inches (157 cm)

### BAGGAGE DIMENSIONS AND WEIGHTS

The maximum exterior dimension (length + width + height) of standard checked baggage is 62 inches (158 cm), including handles and wheels. The maximum weight for checked baggage is based on the class of service and on the traveler's MileagePlus Premier® status at the time of check-in. If you qualify for different allowances based on your class of service and your MileagePlus status, the larger of the two allowances will apply.

## CARRY-ON BAG

### Carry-on bag

The maximum dimensions for a carry-on bag are 9 inches x 14 inches x 22 inches (22 cm x 35 cm x 56 cm), including handles and wheels.



### Personal item

The maximum dimensions for your personal item that fits under the seat in front of you, such as a shoulder bag, purse, laptop bag or other small item, are 9 inches x 10 inches x 17 inches (22 cm x 25 cm x 43 cm). If you are traveling on a Basic Economy ticket, your personal item will be the only item you can bring on board.



### MUSICAL INSTRUMENTS AS A CARRY-ON

You may carry a violin, guitar or other small musical instrument on board as part of your carry-on baggage allowance as long as **the instrument is placed in a hard case** and there is space in the overhead bins or under the seat in front of you when you board the aircraft.
